Helpful Reading Tips

- When an error is made, WAIT to give your child a chance to work on it independently. When you are certain they are going to keep going, stop them by saying something like "Try that again," or "Make it match."
- Ask questions that invite recall AND thinking, such as "Why do you think _____ happened?" or "What do you think _____ means?" Urge rereading to build comprehension as needed.
- Model expressive reading and have your child echo read. Encourage just-right (not too fast, not too slow). Demonstrate how to attend to the punctuation (pausing at the end of sentences, adding expression based on the punctuation mark).
